

## How do I adjust my breast collar?

1) Not all breast collars have D-rings for the breast collar, so you will want to account for the extra length needed to attach the breast collar to the D-Rings.

2) Identify where the D-Rings are located on your saddle in proportion to your pony. Smaller ponies and low set D-rings can benefit from a wither strap to keep the breast collar sitting in a place the shoulder can still move freely.

3) When adjusted correctly, the center of the breast collar will sit in the center of the chest, below the neck line so it will not cut off the air that flows along the bottom of the neck, but not so loose or low that it flops around.



### Breast Collar Measurements

P.P.C. measurements are based on the length of the breast collar from D-Ring to D-Ring as shown above. All breast collars come with adjustable tug straps and extra holes.

Pony: 30" w/ adjustable tugs  
Mini: 24" w/ adjustable tugs.
